# SUNDAY LETER

Series: The Seasons; Easter Sunday, Year C; 20 Apr 2025

Imagine the surprise on the face of Mary of Magdala when she arrived in the garden and saw the great stone had been rolled away, and the tomb empty. Jesus was not there. Confused and disorientated, she turned around, looked up, and saw a man whom she supposed to be the gardener. Hesitatingly, she asked him if he knew the whereabouts of Jesus. He gently said, "Mary".

Her heart must have been bursting with joy when she recognised that it was indeed 'Rabbuni', her Lord and Master. He had risen as he promised. On this Easter Sunday we pray the beautiful lines from the Psalm:

"Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end." (Psalm 117)

How grateful we are that God the Father loved the world so much as to give his only Son – the one who was willing to be crucified on the hill of Calvary – to save humankind from our sins. This was the price that Jesus had to pay so that we, with joy-filled and uplifted hearts, can sing:

"Jesus Christ is Risen today, Alleluia, Alleluia!"


Take a few moments in the silence of your heart and, in a humble act of faith, hear the Risen Lord call you by name.
