The Exaltation of the Holy Cross *Memorial Thursday 14th September.

The discovery of the True Cross is dated to 14th September 320. On 13th September 335 the churches on Calvary were dedicated and the cross that St. Helena discovered was venerated there the next day. The annual commemoration of that event has been celebrated since, in praise of the redemption won for us by Christ.

Our Lady of Sorrows *Memorial Friday 15th September.

Mary, standing by the cross, 'suffered intensely with her only begotten Son and united herself as his Mother to his sacrifice, consenting with love to the offering of the victim who was born of her', whom she also offered to the eternal Father. (Marialis Cultus).

The prayers of humanity are closely linked to the sentiment of awe. The greatness of humankind is infinitesimal compared to the dimensions of the universe. While even an individual's greatest conquests may seem minor, the individual is not an insignificant being. In prayer, a sentiment of mercy is powerfully affirmed. Nothing exists by chance: the secret of the universe takes place when we exchange benevolent glances with another. Psalm 8 affirms that we are a little less than a god, that we are crowned 'with glory and beauty' (Psalm 8:5). Our relationship with God is what makes us great, it is our enthronement. By nature, we are practically nothing, but by vocation, by calling, we are the children of the great King! This is an experience that many of us have had. When the events of life, with all their hardships, risk suffocating the gift of prayer that lies within us, it is enough to look upon a starry sky, sunset or flower to rekindle a spark of gratefulness. This experience is at the heart of the very first page of the Bible. Prayer is the first weapon of hope. You pray and hope grows, it moves forward. I would even say that prayer opens the doors to hope. Hope is out there, but my prayers open the doors. People who pray hold fundamental truths; they are the ones who repeat over and over, first to themselves and then to everyone else, that life, despite all its trials and tribulations, despite the hard days, is full of awe-inspiring grace. As such, it must always be defended and protected.
